- The competition framework begins with multi skills activity through Key Stage 1, which is then progressed to sport specific activity in Key Stage 2 through Quicksticks Challenges and Festivals.
- Quicksticks is England Hockey's priority for introducing the game at Key Stage 2. Alongside Quicksticks, Mini Hockey will continue to be used for more advanced development at Key Stage 2 through to Key Stage 3.
- At Key Stage 3, Mini Hockey can be used as a development game leading into the full 11-a-side game for advanced development and Key Stage 4 delivery. In addition for these key stages Zone Hockey will continue to be used as a development for participants with a disability
